About the Opportunity

Ambassadors scale our impact in 3 ways.



The CoachArt Ambassador Program is a 1-2 hour per week commitment that builds on your current skill sets. Each ambassador leads the build of CoachArt's local presence from the ground up, through a combination of the following:

1. Community Outreach

Oversee outreach in your community to find CoachArt students, follow up with families to ensure they have the information and resources needed to sign up for online programs, create a regional marketing plan to bolster outreach efforts, and advertise online programs.

2. Online Program Administration

Serve as a volunteer alongside CoachArt program staff on online programming calls with students to manage risk and provide additional support.

3. Fundraising

Lead peer-to-peer fundraising efforts to support programs and associated supplies for students.

Ambassador requirements are as follows:

Ambassadors meet the following requirements:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Live in one of the five expansion cities (New York City, Chicago, Dallas, Denver, Portland)
- Be willing to complete a background check
- Have an interest in supporting children with a chronic illness
- No expertise in arts or athletics required

About CoachArt

CoachArt's mission is to create a transformative arts and athletics experience for families impacted by a childhood chronic illness.

Children living with chronic illness may feel isolated because of their condition. Frequent hospital visits and deficient immune systems often cause them to miss time in school and recreational activities. Families, overwhelmed by the cost and demands of ongoing medical care, often lack the resources to seek out or afford extracurricular activities. Healthy siblings are affected too when family resources are focused on a chronically ill child. CoachArt supports these families by offering free recreational lessons that bring a sense of normalcy back into their lives.
